



 - CBA1 (completed in March/April in 2nd Year)
 - CBA2 (completed in October/November in 3rd Year)
 - A state certified project (No drawing or written exam for Junior Cycle)



Strands of Junior Cycle Music

- **Creating and Exploring Music** Learning to read and write music through paper and digital methods. Developing listening skills through listening to different genres of music.
- **Participating and Music-Making** Learning to play instruments and create Electronic music.

Students would be expected to perform in class, and we would encourage them to perform at school events.






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Food







What is Home Economics?

At Junior Cycle, this subject could be renamed as **'Life Skills'.** This is a subject where you will learn how to take care of yourself, others, your home and the environment.

It is much more than cooking and sewing!

Some of the things you learn about are

- your body how to keep it physically and mentally well
- **food** how it nourishes our body, how to buy, store, prepare, cook and serve it
- **using money** how to spend it wisely, how to save it, how we are protected as consumers
- **your home** room planning, designing it, safety and hygiene, how it's impacts the environment
- textiles design and craftwork, basic sewing skills, how to wash and care for your clothes
- sustainability how to be resourceful, grow own food, correct waste disposal, making ethical shopping choices

Assessment

Two Classroom Based assessments. (CBA) These are projects that student do independently to showcase the skills they have learned. They are part of all Junior Cycle Subjects.

- Craftwork CBA 2nd Year
- Food Literacy Skills CBA 3rd Year

Formal Assessment - End of 3rd Year

- Written Exam in June 50%
- Cookery Exam done in May 50%



This subject allows for all students to achieve as it is assessed practically as well as theoretically.

- This is a **practical subject** so you will carry out a lot of activities in school and at home.
- There is **one theory** and **one practical** class each week.

The practical is usually a cookery class where students work in pairs to cook something. Basic dishes are done in 1st year which gradually get more complex so students build up the skills needed to work independently for a cookery exam in 3rd year. Some practical classes focus on textiles where students upcycle something using basic sewing skills or learn a traditional craft such as embroidery or felting.

• Extra- curricular opportunities include Cookery Club, Cake decorating, Baking Competitions and Craft Club.

Subject Overview

The course is three years long and offers examination at Common Level.

Classroom Based Assessment (CBA) 1 – 2nd Year

Group Project done over 4 weeks concentrating on Enterprise (Nov/Dec)

Classroom Based Assessment (CBA) 2 – 3rd Year

Individual Presentation completed over 3 weeks and presented in December. (10% of overall Grade)

Junior Cycle Exam- 3rd Year

90% of overall JC Grade, completed in June





Subject Overview

The Junior Cycle Business curriculum is broken down into three interconnected strands;

1. Personal Finance – being a smart consumer, household budgets, calculating loan repayments, insurance etc.

2. Enterprise – setting up companies, entrepreneurs, business plans and marketing.

3. **Our Economy** - How Ireland is managed and organized, keeping up to date with current affairs.

Optional Subjects/Modern Foreign language Information

Parent/Guardians and students will be presented with information on each of the optional subjects which the school offers. The Subjects are:

In Lusk Community College students study two subjects from the above list for Junior Cycle. The process of choosing subjects is completed on the school's information management system, VSware. Parents will have access to this system via the VSware App. Instructions on the downloading and accessing the App are included in this letter.

Lusk Community College offers a choice between two Modern Foreign Languages:

- 1. Spanish
- 2. French

All students choose one MFL language.

VSware account creation/access

VSware is an in-school information management system which allows schools to manage and store student data such as attendance, reports and assessments, behaviour, subjects and timetables. At this stage parent/guardians will only access VSware to make option/language choices for your son/daughter. Further access will be enabled when school starts in August.

Parent/Guardians may access VSware via the App downloaded to their device or on a browser. Where a sibling is already attending LCC – NO ACTION IS REQUIRED. In this case, your Incoming Son/Daughter will appear next to their sibling in your current VSware Access.



Instructions for Online Payments

In order to facilitate ease of payment of school funds, Lusk Community College is now using the MIT online payment system. This means that you can pay school fees through our secure online system by credit or debit card and keep track of payments paid and print off a receipt.

To set up your online payment account:

- Go to <u>www.luskcommunitycollege.ie</u> select the "ONLINE PAYMENTS" button located in the middle of the homepage.
- 2. For your first time to login select the "Create Account" button.
- Enter your child's first name, surname and PPS number. This system does not accept Irish fadás, accents or apostrophes (e.g. if your surname is O'Shea, enter OShea –no spaces)
- Press NEXT.
- 5. You will be asked to confirm if your address and contact details are correct and you must enter an email address for further communication. (This email address will be used as your username) You must also create and confirm a password. Keep a secure record of these as you will use them to login on future occasions.
- 6. Note that you can edit your child's personal and contact details on the system. If you notice an error in your <u>details</u> please click on the "Edit" button and "Update" once corrections have been made. Please tick the box confirming your details are now correct and click the "Confirm" button.
- 7. You will see at least two tabs in the payment screen depending on how many children you have attending Lusk Community College. Choose the "Family" tab if you wish to pay a number of fees or choose your child's name if you wish to make a payment against that individual.
- 8. Choose the amount you wish to pay from the payment dropdown and click the NEXT button.
- Enter your credit card /debit card details as instructed on the screen and click on the NEXT button.
- 10. You can print and/or save your receipt.

To make payments for the coming academic year, click on the 2022/2023 Year tab.
